Dear Friends,

I want to particularly thank all of you who recently gave us donations in memory of Cecil the Lion. Your donation on behalf of Cecil is part of a world movement to force our world leaders to make public a ban on wild animal by-products and trophies.

We have now seen two leaders, the American and Chinese, advocate a proposed accord to ban all trafficking of animal trophies for any purpose. However it is not clear in this agreement whether they will create a task force and laws to prosecute the offenders.

So we must continue to put pressure on both our government and the Chinese to demand the enforcement and prosecution of any and all traffickers. It is easy for politicians to use issues of this kind for their own political agendas. Please write to your congressman, the White House and the Chinese Embassy that we see proof that this accord is not just to garnish headlines for two politicians who want to look good to the world, but that they will prove their resolve by enforcing the investigation and prosecution of all offenders.

We must not allow them to leave the sentence unfinished, we must demand to see their plan for the execution of this accord.

few months ago, while I was in Kenya, I received a letter that gave me not only hope but encouraged renewed inspiration after years of working for conservation through education.

I have subsequently met with Nicholas and we have discussed a new program which he has inspired and which we are in the process of creating.

The pilot project involves the crucial first year after students leave secondary school and are unable to further their education.

In 2015 there will be approximately 520,000 young people leaving school, the same or more will leave next year.

Less than 12% will go on to higher education or college.

With no infrastructure that offers on-the-job training programs to deal with this enormous population, the future is perilous. Our training program will teach sustainable organic farming methods to a population eager to embrace a new age of agriculture.

### Another Success Story From One Of Our Students


#### Dear Madam:

### News from Kenya

he WHWF is proud to be sponsoring our own Assistant Education Coordinator Samuel Njuki Mahiga as he furthers his own education.

Samuel is completing

his second year post-graduate studies at Karatina University studying for a Master's of Science degree in Environmental Studies with a biological option. He paid all of his school fees thus far on his own.

In addition to completing his second year of studies, Samuel is working on his academic research thesis on the effects of vegetation type and structure on forest bird community composition in the Nanyuki Forest Block.

Student groups visiting the Education Center since our last newsletter planted almost 400 trees and helped clean up plastic bags in Kanyuki Village. The rural instruction and pen pal programs are in full swing, and a new classroom for special needs students was completed at Mlima Kenya Primary School. Fourteen UN delegates, in Kenya for a global conference on climate change, visited the EC to learn about our various conservation programs. They particularly were impressed with the sewage water recycling plant and the greenhouse made of plastic bottles.

Fourteen elephants were recently poisoned with cyanide-laced oranges in Tsavo National Park and their tusks hacked off with chainsaws. Elephants will be extinct within a decade unless we stop these despicable, heartless acts, which fund terrorism.

We must quell the demand or they won't survive the decade. The United States is the second largest market for illegal ivory, so please write your representatives in Congress and ask

them to support ivory bans legislatively and provide a framework for enforcement of recent agreements with China.

Won't you please join us in writing to the embassies of the countries fueling the blood ivory trade,



indicating that you will boycott all products from their respective countries until they outlaw the sale of ALL ivory and rhino horn and commit to stringently enforcing those laws? These majestic animals need your voice! If not you, then who?
