I am overjoyed to announce the completion and inauguration of the Ngenia Secondary School's new JI Foundation Library. In 1985, the JI Foundation donated and endowed a library at Ngenia when the students in attendance at the school numbered half of today's student body. For all these years, the original library served the school well and greatly enhanced the curricula.

Clearly, the size of the original structure was inadequate for the needs of today and, with the support and generosity of James Lovelace, we not only have been able to provide a new and greatly improved library, but also will be able to use and re-imagine the former library into a training center for school leavers, as part of a pilot project sponsored by The Annenberg Foundation.

This pilot project is designed to offer training applicable to girls and boys who would not otherwise go on to higher education. It is an effort to create career opportunities that have the potential of breaking the chain of poverty. In addition to courses in cooking, sewing, beauty shop, mechanics and carpentry, innovative and sustainable organic farming methods will be taught at this purpose built facility. Building of the infrastructure for this pilot project has already begun.

After the turbulence of the recent elections, stability has returned to Kenya, and with your help we look forward to positive progress in our dedication to conservation through education.

This will help us improve our learning in languages and other subjects and form a base of our visions and our career dreams. We also cannot forget to thank you for your time used thinking about us. May the Almighty God bless you.

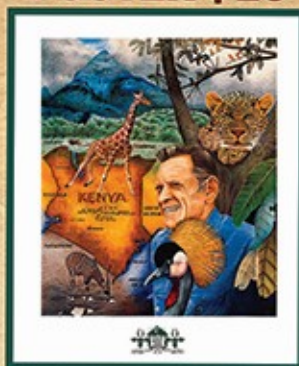
