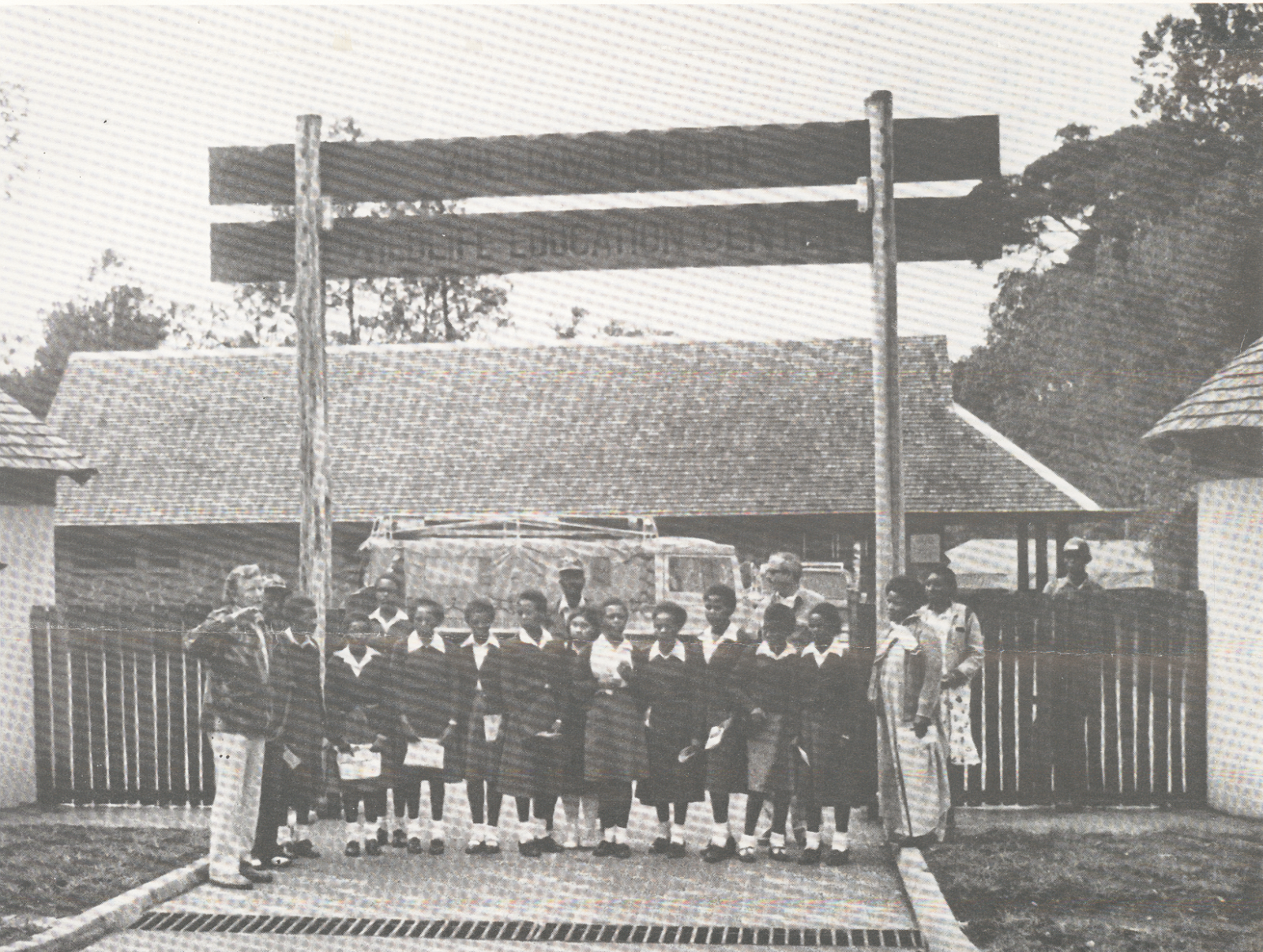

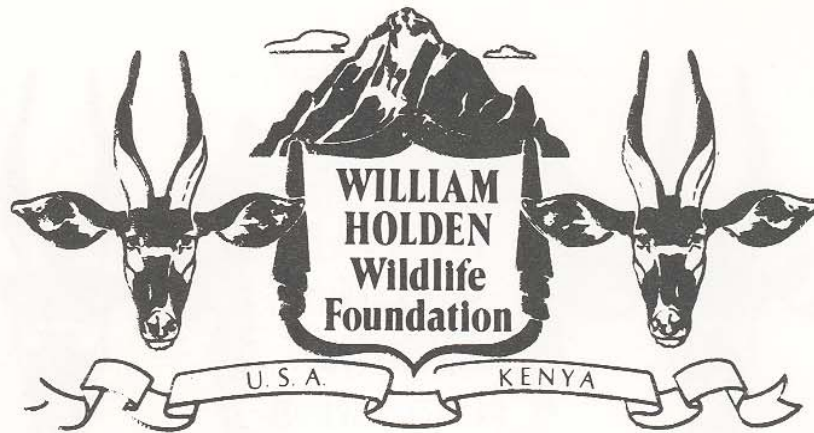

Dear Friends,



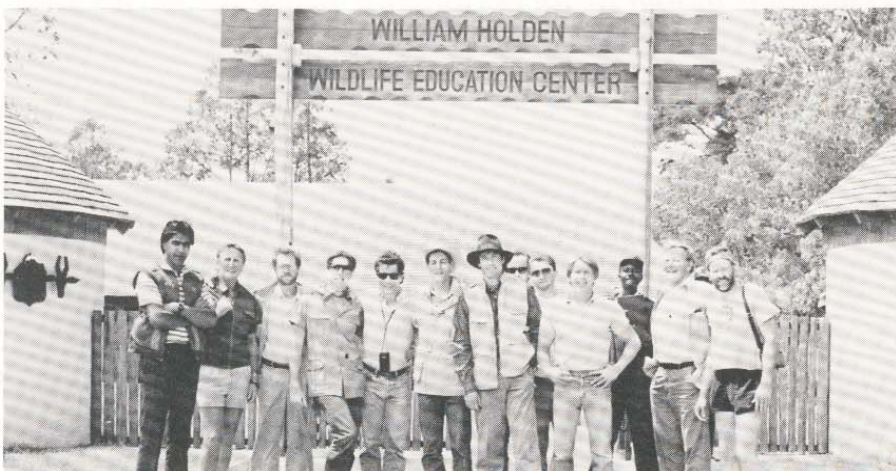
