Dear Friends,

With the greatest of pride and gratitude we announce that Phase I of the WILLIAM HOLDEN WILDLIFE EDUCATION CENTER has been successfully operating since its inauguration in May 1984 and the endowment fund is now complete. At current costs the revenue from the endowment will carry Phase I for many years to come without further funding.

Thus was our hope... to realize the dreams of William Holden and create an organization that would last in perpetuity; that this work would not depend on any of the founding directors in order to carry on all that is so vital to the future of wild species.

On behalf of the nearly 15,000 students currently attending Phase I of the Education Center, I thank you.

May I now introduce you to Phase II. The Tom Mankiewicz Library will be the first building on the site, creating a bridge to higher education and research for African students. There is a growing demand for scholarships abroad to study conservation and captive breeding and bring home that technology to Kenya. The young African has no possibility of learning those skills at home nor does the researcher from the U.S. and other countries have a first class veterinary laboratory in Kenya where such reproductive research can be carried out that will benefit all countries. Dr. Betsy Dresser of the Cincinnati Zoo, a leader in embryo transplants, has agreed to help design the research laboratory along with Dr. Warren Thomas, Director of the L.A. Zoo, both of whom are very excited at the opportunities this facility will afford.

Conservation leaders from all over Africa have come to Phase I for seminars and long for the ongoing exchanges Phase II will inspire.

We are all too well aware of the fragile eco-balance that forms the thread from which life itself hangs. Education, and only education is the salvation of our planet. Captive breeding of species to insure their future backed up by education is clearly the only hope for the animal population and ultimately the human population of the continent whose healthy eco-balance has worldwide ramifications.
