



Baubles, Bangles and Beads, tossed casually in the back of a drawer along with other "costume" jewelry is anything but a costume to the animal who has just been slaughtered to produce these fashion trends! 70 thousand elephants a year are killed to meet the world demand for Ivory. Americans buy 1/3.

The sad fact is, that a poacher sees a potential to earn 6 months wages in one go. The game departments of some countries look like para military operations and still they cannot match the sophisticated weapons such as AK 47's that allow the poachers to mow down 10 or 15 elephants in one go then take out their chain saws and saw off their faces, because hacking away at the tusks with knives takes too long.

Accessories To Murder.

My god, what have we become to allow this to happen!

The escalation of elephant poaching in the last 3 years points to figures that indicate beyond any doubt that within 10 years, there will be no elephant existing in the whole of East Africa.

Viewing a group of elephants on the move, and observing the intricate family relationships and the amazingly sensitive behavior is one of the most impressive spectacles to behold.

For millions of years these creatures have roamed the planet only to arrive at this supposedly magnificent moment in man's evolution where they are to become a victim of our fancy. What a dreadful fate! What a sad end!

This is not a cause that we can distance ourselves from because we either don't have the money or we don't have the political clout to change things, this is a case where it takes neither.
